WIMMERA AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES ASSOCIATION (WASA) COMPETITIONS


Regulations:

- 1. 1. A person having won at a local Show will compete at a Wimmera Group final in November 2023.
- 2. A person having won at Show level, is not eligible for entry at any other show until after the Group judging, when, if not the winning entry, can compete again.
- 3. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 4. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group Final, then 2nd placegetters eligible to compete.
- 5. WASA. entrants must reside in the boundaries of the Wimmera Group.
- 6. Winners at WASA. Group Final receive \$25 cash.
- 7. Items, except Cookery Exhibits, which are entered in the Wimmera final judging, must be exactly the same as won at local Show.

VICTORIAN AGRICULTURAL SHOWS. (VAS) COMPETITIONS

Regulations:

- 1. A person can represent only one Society or Group for VAS.
- 2. An article having won at Show level will compete at Group Final, winner will then compete at next Melbourne Royal.
- 3. An article having won Group Final cannot compete further until after the Melbourne Royal.
- 4. An article, having won at the Melbourne Royal in any class is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- 5. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 6. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, then 2nd place-getter is eligible to compete.
- 7. Items, except Cookery exhibits, must be the same as won at local Show or Group.
- 8. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize-money.
- 9. An article, having won first at a Show, cannot be shown at any other State Show that year.
- 10. All work to have been completed within the last 12 months.
- 11. Professionals are not eligible.



15. If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one group final the exhibitor must forfeit/ refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
